Coaches were selected after a competitive interviewing process. As a coach, I was paired with a woman who was (at the time) in jail and had a history of domestic violence. The coaching relationship continued once the woman was released from jail, with the intention of assisting her in avoiding familiar pitfalls related to unhealthy situations and to avoid recidivating. Some of the responsibilities included:
- Providing guidance, emotional support, and resource referrals to coaching partner
 - Having weekly meetings in the jail with coaching partner to establish relationship and trust
 - Having regular meetings with coaching partner after her release and assisting her in finding pro-social activities to participate in, developing healthy habits, and serving as a role model
 - Serving as friend, mentor, and resource for coaching partner to assist her in her transition to life after release from jail
